Live Online Teaching - Synchronous

- Inconsistent class-to-class
- Not meaningful- teaching or Zoom chats?
- Not enough interaction- too short of lessons or too infrequent
- Why can't school just run on the normal schedule via Zoom?
- Imbalance of social vs. academic
- Students more willing to engage online with teachers than parents



Student Teacher Meetings and Interactions

• Feedback

- Higher expectations for teacher and student engagement
- Class meetings or class chats?
- Direct instruction is inconsistent
- Grids need more instruction by teachers
- More frequent meetings
- Daily schedule

Student-Teacher Meetings and Interactions

- Not enough school work
- Resource reallocation
 - Elementary specialists
- Workload balance and inconsistent
- Increase interaction time with expectations
 - Face present in Zoom
- Schoolwide daily check-ins?
- Student projects to encourage collaboration
- More individual reaching out



Student Feedback, Grades, and Assessments

- How are elementary students being assessessed
 - Not all assignments are turned in
- How are we measuring progress?
- Why are all students earning an A?
- How does participation impact the grade?
- Not receiving constructive feedback
- Using former grading practices in new environment does not make sense

Learning Standards



- Are students reaching the same standards this year?
- What is the plan to "catch students up?
- Students who need more support
- Will students be ready for next year?
- Should we retain our student?
- How will the learning expectations and standards be different in the fall?
