The Lotus Scholarship

The Lotus Scholarship is awarded to students who are finishing high school this spring and live in King, Pierce, and Snohomish counties. Applicants must have immigrated to the United States within the last four years and be under 21 years of age. The SYL Foundation awards several Lotus Scholarships of \$1,500 per year, which is renewable for 3 additional years. The award increases up to \$3,000 per year in the last two years of college. To be eligible for this year's scholarship, the student must have moved to the United States after June 15, 2016 and be graduating from high school in 2020. The deadline to apply is March 23, 2020.

This is a competitive program and students will be asked to interview with a committee from the SYL Foundation as part of the application process. More information about the program is available at:
